Key Notable Measures in the Judicial Domain

Non-Implementation of Qisas Punishment through Obtaining the Consent of the Next of Kin

- Obtaining the consent of the next of kin and the non-implementation of the punishment of qisas for 67 individuals sentenced to qisas nationwide, from 21 March to 21 June 2026, of which 21 cases have ended in peace and reconciliation as a result of the efforts of Dispute Resolution Branches across the country.

Reconciliation as a Result of the Efforts of the Dispute Resolution Council

- Reconciliation and settlement achieved in 44/14 percent of concluded, reconcilable cases in Dispute Resolution Branches nationwide from 21 March to 21 June 2026;
- Release of 4373 prisoners and prevention of the imprisonment of 201 individuals as a result of achieving reconciliation, through the efforts of Dispute Resolution Council branches stationed in prisons and peace mediators (Peace Companions) across the country from 21 March to 21 June 2026.

Release from Prison through the Assistance of Benefactors and the Efforts of the Blood Money (Diyyah) Committee

- The release of 2407 prisoners convicted of unintentional offenses from prisons across the country from 21 March to 21 June 2026, through the assistance of the Blood Money (Diyyah) Committee and charitable benefactors, with payments exceeding 11114 billion Rials.

Leave and Release through the Use of Leniency Mechanisms

- Approval of pardon and release of 1235 individuals and sentence reduction for 2,108 convicted persons nationwide on the occasion of Eid al-Ghadir (June 4, 2026). It should be noted that among those granted clemency were 96 women, 46 foreign nationals, 1 security convict, and 6 offenders aged 18 years or younger.

- The release of 20338 prisoners nationwide through the application of legal leniency measures and judicial facilities from 21 March to 21 June 2026;
- Issuance of more than 37962 cases of alternative punishments to imprisonment by judges nationwide, from 21 March to 21 June 2026;
- 117855 prisoners nationwide benefiting from more than 304483 instances of prison leave, from 21 March to 21 June 2026;
- The release of 4397 eligible prisoners nationwide from 21 March to 21 June 2026, through the use of electronic monitoring (electronic ankle bracelets).

Visits to Prisons, Oversight of the Rights of Prisoners and Clients of the Judiciary, and Facilitation of Electronic Judicial Proceedings

- Meetings held and requests reviewed for 624987 individuals referring to judicial complexes nationwide by Chief Justices of provincial courts, prosecutors, and other judicial officials from 21 March to 21 June 2026, with the necessary orders issued accordingly;
- Review of 243 public petitions by judges and judicial officials nationwide through the establishment of public service desks in mosques, prayer halls (Mosallas), and other venues from 21 March to 21 June 2026;
- Provision of consultation and responses to the requests of 3059 individuals who referred in person to the General Department of Public Communications of the Judiciary from 21 March to 21 June 2026, and meetings with and review of the requests of 2230 of these individuals by the Director General and the judges assigned to this Directorate General.
- Responding to 11362 requests registered in the Judiciary's Public Communications System (SAME') from 21 March to 21 June 2026;
- Conducting more than 28271 prison visits by judges nationwide and holding meetings with 99395 prisoners from 21 March to 21 June 2026, resulting in the issuance of orders granting prison leave to more

than 63100 prisoners, orders for the release of more than 24056 prisoners, approval of more than 7456 requests for employment, and approval of the application of legal leniency measures for more than 22058 prisoners;

- Holding more than 109318 electronic judicial proceedings for prisoners in civil and criminal courts nationwide from 21 March to 21 June 2026.
- Conducting 901 video visits between prisoners and their families in prisons across the country.
- Allocation of 1140415 appointments to clients electronically and without in-person attendance, through the electronic appointment scheduling system for referral to branches and centralized units for enforcement of judgments, from 21 March to 21 June 2026;
- Issuance of 878333 certificates of no criminal record to applicants electronically and without in-person attendance, through the online system for registering requests for certificates of no criminal record, from 21 March to 21 June 2026.

Education, Vocational Training, Employment of Prisoners, and Support for their Families

- Conducting vocational training and employment courses for more than 26189 prisoners, from 21 March to 21 June 2026;
- Providing support, medical, and educational services to more than 50431 families of prisoners nationwide through Prisoners' Support Associations;
- Employment of more than 63728 prisoners from 21 March to 21 June 2026, with monthly wages paid to them.

Key Notable Measures in the Non-Judicial Domain

Establishment of the “National Children’s Channel” on the Shaad Messaging Platform

March 27, 2026- according to a report by the Ministry of Education, the “National Children’s Channel” was established and launched on the Shaad messaging platform with the aim of enhancing the education and learning of kindergarten-age children and raising parents’ awareness.

Construction of 2,000-Megawatt Solar Power Plants to Empower Beneficiaries of the Imam Khomeini Relief Foundation

April 20, 2026- according to a report by the Imam Khomeini Relief Foundation, solar power plants with a total capacity of up to 2,000 megawatts will be constructed nationwide with the aim of empowering beneficiaries supported by the Foundation, in cooperation with Capital Investment Power and Kish Free Zone Development Company.

Establishment of the National Platform for Online Judicial Services

April 21, 2026- according to the report of the Center for Electronic Judicial Services Offices, a national and modern platform for providing online judicial services was launched, relying on a new regulatory model and with the active participation of knowledge-based companies and the private sector. This platform is designed to facilitate access to judicial services for members of the public and reduce in-person visits to courts.

Registration of 248 Patents and More than 11,000 Sports

Trademarks in the Country

April 26, 2026- according to the National Real Estate and Documents Registration Organization, 248 patents, 136 industrial plans, and more than 11,180 trademarks have been registered in the field of sports. This statistic indicates the high capacity for innovation in this sector.

80 Percent of Thalassemia Medicine Produced Domestically

April 27, 2026- according to the Thalassemia Patients Association, 80 percent of thalassemia medicine is produced domestically. Currently, there are 23,000 thalassemia patients in the country, with Sistan and Baluchestan leading the way with 3,710 patients.

557,000 Environmentalists are Active Nationwide

May 3, 2026- according to the report of the head of the Environmental Protection Organization, more than 557,000 environmentalists are active nationwide.

Tehran Will Have the Largest Motorcycle Ambulance Fleet in the Region

May 11, 2026- according to the report of the Tehran Provincial Emergency Service, with the addition of 100 new motorcycle ambulances in the coming days, the number of active motorcycle ambulances in the province will reach about 320; a measure aimed at reducing the time for handling relief missions and increasing the speed of service provision.

Provision of Online Counseling Services by the Iranian Red Crescent to 11,000 People during the War

May 16, 2026- according to a report by the Iranian Red Crescent Society, online counseling and psychological services were provided to 11,000 Iranian citizens during the war through the “Helalita” platform, through the efforts of the Preschool and Student Affairs Department of the Youth Organization.

Education of 360,000 Foreign-National Students in 20,000 Schools across the Country

May 16, 2026- according to a report by the Center for International Affairs of the Ministry of Education, 360,000 foreign-national students are currently studying in 20,000 schools across the country.

80 Percent of Licenses for the Establishment of Home-Based Businesses Are Issued to Women

May 25, 2026- according to a report by the Vice Presidency for Women and Family Affairs, more than three million licenses for home-based businesses have been issued in the country, approximately 80 percent of which have been issued to women. This demonstrates the considerable capacity of women to play an economic role in family.

Installation of Solar Power Plants in 12,000 Schools

June 2, 2026- according to a report by the Ministry of Education, a ceremony marking the commencement of the installation of solar power plants in 12,000 schools across the country was held at Shahid Chamran Technical and Vocational School.

Transfer of 598 Afghan Prisoners to their Home Country

June 11, 2026- according to a report by the Ministry of Justice, 598 Afghan prisoners were transferred to their home country; the custodial sentences imposed on these individuals were predominantly in connection with drug-related offenses.

Transformation of Tehran Metro Stations into Civic Education Classrooms

June 15, 2026- according to a report by the Municipality, the one-day “Nomand” civic education event was held at 64 selected Tehran Metro stations. The initiative was implemented in cooperation with the Cultural and Social Affairs Department of the Tehran and Suburbs Metro Operating Company, with the participation of 120 field educators, in line with the need to protect the urban environment and reduce the volume of waste destined for landfilling.

Activity of More than 1,000 Environmental Houses

June 21, 2026- according to a report by the Department of Environment, more than 1,360 Environmental Houses are active across the country, and many of these centers operate on a specialized basis in areas such as children, waste management, and other specialized environmental issues.

Inauguration of the Largest Cancer Treatment Hospital in the Country

June 2, 2026- the new building of the Cancer Institute Hospital of Iran, serving as the country's scientific hub for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of various types of cancer, was inaugurated. The 18-story building has a floor area of 60,000 square meters. It is regarded as the largest cancer treatment hospital in the country and the Middle East and was constructed with the participation of charitable donors. The facility has 37 specialized departments, 11 imaging and radiotherapy units, and 96 chemotherapy beds. The construction cost of the project is estimated at approximately 120,000 billion Rials, and the cost of equipping the medical facility is estimated at 46,000 billion Rials.

Iran among the World's Top 20 Scientific-Producing Countries;

Leading in the Growth Rate of Scientific Impact

May 10, 2026- according to the head of the Islamic World Science Citation Center (ISC), Iran recorded the highest growth rate among the world's top 20 countries in terms of scientific output, based on the field-normalized citation impact indicator. This rate reached 12/1 percent in 2024. This achievement indicates that Iranian research has gained greater international visibility than in the past and that the country's scientific impact is improving.
